Tagalog: The Philippines has many Tagalog dialects. However, the three dialects that are most widespread are Cebuano, Tagalog, and Ilocano. The Cebuano dialect, which was the first to emerge, was the product of mixing between the ethnic groups of the Visayas who settled in the Cebu island. The Visayan languages, which have almost all, gone through some form of Tagalogization, were brought by migrants from the Visayas. The variant of Tagalog used in the Philippines today is called "Tagalog proper" as opposed to "Filipino" in English. The Tagalog nouns are limited to the ones used by the people of Cebu, Panay, and Negros. Tagalog is the official language of the Philippines. Its other varieties are in the Visayan languages, which are at least two in number, namely Tagbanwa and Hiligaynon. In the Diray-Iban, the Iban/Ibano peoples of Sarawak in Borneo use the Cebuano dialect of Tagalog which is identical with that used in the Visayas. The dialect used by the Hiligaynon people in the Cordillera region of the Philippines is different, but also somewhat related to Tagalog.
